Any 4-Her who joins 4-H before May 1st may participate in 4-H Softball. We typically have three leagues; Junior league for ages 8-12, Intermediate league for ages 11-14, and Senior league for ages 13-18.

- Each team must submit a complete roster to the Extension Office prior to the first game; the team Roster is due May 17th this year.
- Coaches and Umpire information must be submitted by May 17th of that season, coaches must be official volunteers—call us if you are not sure if you are.
- Each year the Rules and Guidelines are agreed upon by the coaches and assistants at the first meeting of the season.
- Each player have Consent Form and Code of Conduct form filled out by the first game.
- Each year a Softball Chair will be appointed and will act as the main liaison between 4-H Softball and the Extension Dunn County. This year Troy Steinmeyer has agreed to take the role of "Commissioner" once again. Be sure to say thank you when you see him. While you are at it, be sure to thank the coaches, umps, and parents too!

We want to make sure to thank and recognize these amazing people. Please take a moment to nominate a deserving 4-H Adult Leader or Community Partner. Nominations are due by May 31st, 2019.

You can complete this online form, https://forms.gle/e2cccsvoq16Eof1f6, or you can print the applications from https://dunn.extension.wisc.edu/4-h-youth-development/awards/, fill them out and drop them off OR mail them in at the Extension Dunn County Office.

The **Partners in 4-H** award is meant to recognize outstanding contributions from individuals, organizations, or business to the 4-H program. "Partners in 4-H" nominees have impacted the Dunn County 4-H in some special way and is ultimately selected by the Leaders Council. A recipient may only receive this award every ten years.

The **Volunteer of the Year award** is sponsored by the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation and is selected locally by the Dunn County 4-H Leaders Council. Volunteer of the year nominees have gone above and beyond to serve 4-H on the club, county, state, and/or national level. A recipient may only receive this award once.

The **Alumni Award** is meant to recognize 4-H Alumni. Recipients may be alumni from anywhere in the county and must be a current active leader working in many ways to help youth in their present adult life. A recipient may only receive this award once.

- When making a nomination for the "4-H Alumni Award" please consider the person's interest in 4-H in their adult life and reflect on their accomplishments when they were a member.
- A maximum of four alumni may receive this award each year.

How to Apply for Graduation Dunn County 4-H Youth Development

"Graduation for 4-H members will be recognized as either high school graduation or the year in which membership is terminated due to age. In order to receive graduation recognition during the annual 4-H awards celebration (held during the Dunn County Fair), members and/or club's must alert the Dunn County UW-Extension Office by June 1st of the year in which they intend to graduate."

Tractor Safety

Tractors are a valuable part of any farm business, but can be unsafe if employees are not prepared with the right training. This course offers skills on basic farm safety, proper tractor operations, connecting and using implements and more. Get the job done more safely and efficiently!

Twelve year olds are eligible for a State of Wisconsin Certificate to drive tractors for their parents. Youth ages 13 and older are eligible for a Federal Certificate on their 14th birthday, allowing them to drive tractors for an employer. Youth involved in hazardous occupations other than on a farm operated by their parents, must have a Certificate of Exemption from these regulations in order to engage in such employment.
