Small Animal Project is a combination of the Poultry Project and the Rabbit Project where you care for your animal while learning about different aspects of animal care including but not limited to identifying, selecting, handling, feeding, breeding and market. Then you have the opportunity to sell your animal/s in the Small Animal Auction at the Dunn County Fair.

## Features and Benefits of Small Animal Project

- ♥ Small Animals take up less space and less money for feed.
- ♥ Rewarding project as you can view the life cycle of the animal.
- ♥ Chickens are great at bug control.
- ♥ Market class projects do not need to be kept over winter.
- ♥ Fast growing, short term, exciting project
- ♥ Rabbits produce great fertilizer you can use immediately.
- ♥ Growing your own food and knowing what went into them.

All those who are NEW or are interested in selling at the auction **must attend one Small Animal Project Orientation** in order to sell.

Educational points due by July 1st

- You may go to an in person event
- Or take YQCA online

Must contact at least 3 buyers before the fair

Provide sale animal information at check-in at the fair

Must do barn duty & set up for

auction half hour before the auction

Must connect with your buyer at the

fair, animal pick up, and thank-you cards

## Dunn Co. Fair Food Stand Rules



- ⇒ Hair must be pulled back (if long) and covered with hat or hair-net even if you have short hair!
- ⇒ No sandals or flip-flops – must have close-toed shoes.
- ⇒ Absolutely NO barn boots or barn clothes in the stand. If you are working in the barn before your shift, bring clean clothes to change into before you start your food stand shift.
- ⇒ Please come to your shift 10 minutes early so you can get signed in, washed up, and taught (or refreshed) your position.
- ⇒ At least ½ of the shift must be adults. i.e. – a shift of 10 must be 5 adults.
- ⇒ Age to work in the stand is 12. To run the griddles and ipads/cash registers, 16.
- ⇒ No one younger than 12 allowed in the front of the food stand. Younger ones may sweep and clean up tables in the eating area.
- ⇒ You will only be paid for the amount of workers scheduled in your shift. If 10 are in your shift, 10 will be paid, even if there are 12 working.
- ⇒ Absolutely NO armpits!! Sorry! No one wants to see pit hair – guys or girls! NO tank tops, halters, sleeveless, etc. This is a great time to wear your 4-H club t-shirts!
- ⇒ No eating the food without paying! This is a fundraiser for all the clubs (that participate!) You can NOT have free food on your shift.
- ⇒ You may drink while on your shift – but please keep the bottle at the back. I will have pens/markers available to mark your drinks – and you can even keep them in the fridge, provided there is room.
- ⇒ SMILE! Be friendly! Public perception is important!

This year's pay will reflect the following of these rules. Flat rate pay (approx.. \$13 an hour) to everyone, bonus pay (last year was \$17 an hour!) to the clubs who strive to abide by the rules. And some are mandatory from the health department. Do a good job following these rules as a club and earn your BONUS!

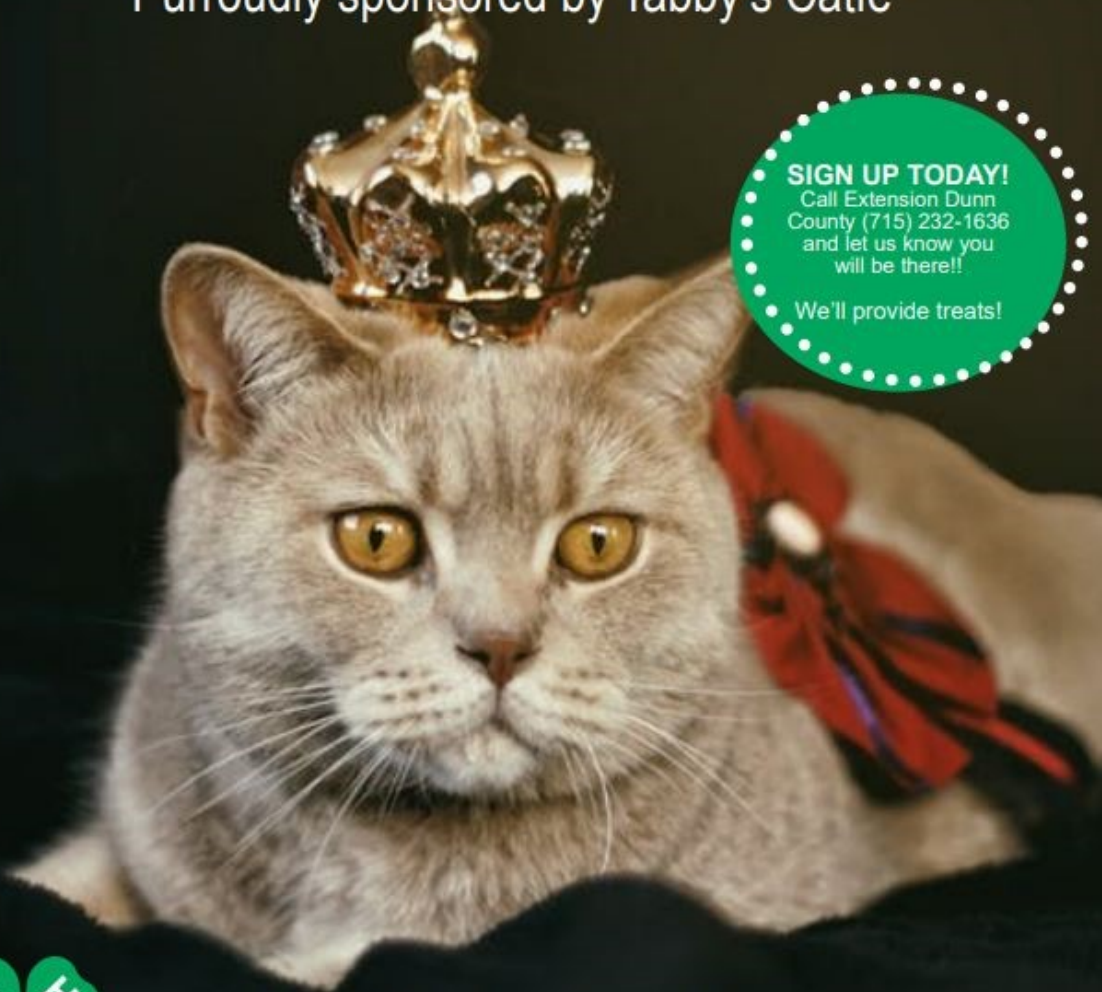

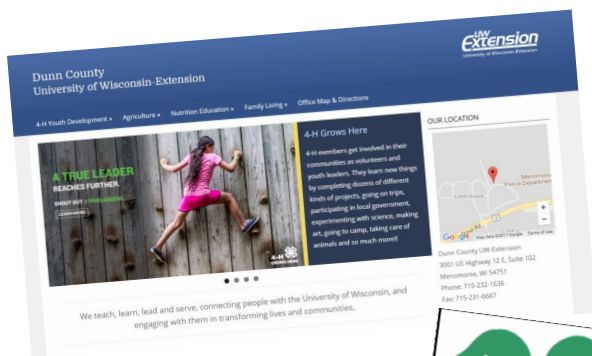

Hi! I'm Kenzie Brantner,





