NOTE FROM OUR TREASURER

As with most service organizations, we have been losing members. It is difficult for younger people to fit the time commitments into their schedules. Let me explain the current financial situation.

Over the past 5 years, we have lost 26 members. Membership dues are \$7 per member. Of that, \$5 goes to the State HCE, \$0.40 goes to the NW District HCE, and \$1.60 stays with the Dunn County HCE. Losing 26 members results in about a \$40 loss of revenue from memberships. That is not too much. However, it also results in a loss in raffle ticket sales that amounts to about \$130.

We have also lost revenue from the Autumn Fair and Craft Show. This was discontinued in 2016. The event was becoming more and more work with fewer and fewer members attended. The lost revenue from that event amounts to about \$400.

To address our long-term financial security, the Executive Board is looking for \$600 in new revenue and/or budget cuts. We are looking at reducing Executive Board State Conference reimbursements. We are looking at increasing dues – or leaving dues as is and asking those who can afford it to include an extra \$3 for our Bookworms and Scholarship accounts. We are looking at adding another fundraiser such as a Fall Festival.

We are also hoping for increases in voluntary donations. Many clubs and individuals make regular donations to Bookworms. These voluntary donations cover over half the cost of the Bookworms program. We want to start acknowledging donations and who they are meant to honor or remember. They will be listed in our newsletters. This newsletter includes all donations that have been received so far this year. Please consider honoring someone with a donation to either Bookworms or the Scholarship Fund. Any amount is welcome.
